Sorokousty Memorial Services: In a few short weeks, the holy season of the Great Fast (Lent) will once again be upon us. We honor the memory of our beloved deceased with Sorokousty Memorial Services on all Saturdays of Lent. Please use your Sorokousty envelope, or write the names on a piece of paper and place it in an envelope and place it in the collection basket. Please put your name or your family name on the envelope.

Triodion: In the Byzantine Tradition, Lent is preceded by the "Triodion" (three odes). Triodion is a time to prepare for the Great Fast; a time to contemplate the mysteries of the human condition; a time to consider the reality of who we are before God and the Great Mercy of our Lord in claiming us as his own. The Triodion begins with the Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee, followed by the Sunday of the Prodigal Son, Sunday of the Last Judgement, and ends with Forgiveness Sunday.

THE BLESSING OF CANDLES Prayer: Jesus Christ, You are the True Light that en-lightens every man coming into the world (Jn. 1, 9); bestow Your blessing on these candles and sanctify them with the light of Your grace; deign, O Gracious One, that as they, kindled with the visible flame, dispel the darkness of night, so also our hearts, enlightened by the invisible light of Your Holy Spirit, may escape the darkness of sin; and that with cleansed eyes of our soul we may see all those things that are pleasing to you and necessary for our salvation; so that after having triumphed over the powers of darkness in this world we may finally attain the everlasting light of heaven. For You are our salvation, and we render glory to You, with Your Eternal Father and Your AII- Holy, Gracious and Life-giving Spirit, now and ever, and forever. Amen.
