Sorokousty Memorial Services: In a few short weeks, the holy season of the Great Fast (Lent) will once again be upon us. We honor the memory of our beloved deceased with Sorokousty Memorial Services on all Saturdays of Lent. Triodion: In the Byzantine Tradition, Lent is preceded by the “Triodion” (three odes). Triodion is a time to prepare for the Great Fast; a time to contemplate the mysteries of the human condition; a time to consider the reality of who we are before God and the Great Mercy of our Lord in claiming us as his own. The Triodion begins with the Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee, followed by the Sunday of the Prodigal Son, Sunday of the Last Judgement, and ends with Forgiveness Sunday.

The Good Samaritan Food Pantry is open Monday through Thursday from 10 am to 2 pm. Food is distributed every Tuesday. The Food Pantry helps 60 families a month at this Philadelphia location at 827 N. Franklin Street. Sr. Teodora Kopyn, OSBM, who is the Director of the Food Pantry said for a whole month the only parish that was contributing to the food pantry was the Cathedral in Philadelphia.
