**Father Klanichka** will celebrate Divine Liturgy Byzantine Rite on Sundays, July 30<sup>th</sup>, and August 27<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 PM, at St. Jude the Apostle Roman Catholic Church, 152 Tulip Drive, Lewes, DE 19958. Please come and celebrate the Divine Liturgy with us!

**Preserve and promote our own traditions: when you enter**, it is customary to first go to the Tetrapod Table up front, in the middle of church — we are to make the sign of the cross, bow, and kiss the icon and cross displayed. We then bow and make the sign of the cross again, and then go to light candles or take our place for Liturgy. In our Ukrainian Greco-Catholic Churches, we make the Sign of the Cross (holding together the right thumb, index and middle fingers) starting with our forehead, then to our mid-chest, then to our right shoulder first, then the left shoulder. Also in our churches, we do not genuflect (brief bending of the right knee towards the altar) - instead we make the sign of the cross the Eastern way, and bow towards the altar. And remember that church is a holy place, so try to keep quiet (not to talk or laugh loudly) before, during, or after the church services. Let’s preserve and promote our own and beautiful traditions.

**Dormition Fast** – beginning Aug. 1<sup>st</sup> through Aug. 14<sup>th</sup>. Abstinence from meat on Wednesdays and Fridays.

**Holyday of Obligation** – Tuesday, August 15<sup>th</sup> is the **Dormition (Assumption) of our Most Holy Mother of God and Ever Virgin Mary**. The Divine Liturgy will be celebrated at 10:00 AM and 7:00 PM. As is our custom, we will have the traditional blessing of flowers, plants, and herbs. Mirovania (Anointing with Holy Oil) after the Divine Liturgy.

**Father Klanichka** will be on vacation from August 16<sup>th</sup> through August 26<sup>th</sup>. In case of an emergency and any needs of the priest, please call **Father Daniel Troyan at 717-554-2994** from Holy Myrrh-Bearer’s Ukrainian Church in Swarthmore, PA.

**Confessions:** If you would like to receive the grace of forgiveness in the Mystery of Confession, a priest is available to hear confessions every half hour before the Divine Liturgy at 9:30 am on Sundays. Avail yourself of God’s gifts of mercy and spiritual renewal.

**For Receiving Holy Communion:** Please come forward, tilt your head back slightly, open your mouth wide, (do not stick out your tongue and do not say, “Amen”). After priest gives you the Holy Eucharist, close your mouth, consume the Holy Eucharist, and return to your place.
